RESOLUTION NO. R-17-1178

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MAPLE VALLEY, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING 2018 ANNUAL RATE ADJUSTMENT OF THE SURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT FEES.

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Valley has the responsibility to maintain and operate the surface water management system; and

WHEREAS, the Western Washington National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permit issued on January 17, 2007 requires the City of Maple Valley to develop and implement a Stormwater Management Program; and

WHEREAS, the Maple Valley Municipal Code (“MVMC”) Section 13.05.040 requires that fees related to storm drainage and surface water management services contemplated herein shall be set forth by resolution; and

WHEREAS, in September 2014, the City of Maple Valley adopted Resolution No. R-14-998 to increase Surface Water Management Fees annually in accordance with the preceding year’s annual change in the August-to-August-Seattle-Bremerton-Tacoma Consumer Price Index (Urban Consumers) published by the U.S. Department of Labor; and

WHEREAS, the percent annual change in 2017 in the August-to-August-Seattle-Bremerton-Tacoma Consumer Price Index (Urban Consumers) published by the U.S. Department of Labor is 2.5%; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Valley intends to prepare a rate study of the Surface Water Management fees in the year 2018; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Valley desires to accumulate sufficient resources to make improvements to the surface water and storm drainage infrastructure as necessary and when possible in conjunction with transportation improvements within the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAPLE VALLEY, WASHINGTON, DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Fees. The 2017 Schedule of Surface Water Management Fees, attached as Exhibit A

Section 2. Annual Rate Adjustment. Effective January 1st for the years 2018, beginning on January 1, 2018, the Surface Water Management Fees listed on Exhibit A shall be adjusted by the preceding year’s annual change in the August-to-August Seattle-Bremerton-Tacoma Consumer Price Index (Urban Consumers) published by the U.S. Department of Labor.
