RESOLUTION NO. R-20-1489**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MAPLE VALLEY, WASHINGTON,  
AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SEEK REIMBURSEMENT  
FROM THE WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE UP  
TO THE NEWLY ALLOCATED AMOUNT OF \$392,700 OF CARES ACT  
FUNDING FOR THOSE ELIGIBLE EXPENSES INCURRED DUE TO THE  
PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY WITH RESPECT TO COVID-19  
DURING THE PERIOD OF MARCH 1, 2020 THRU NOVEMBER 30, 2020.**

WHEREAS, Council provided authorization by approving Resolution R-20-1453 to accept from the State of Washington a portion of the federal Coronavirus Relief Funds to local governments, which included an award of \$785,400 to the City of Maple Valley; and

WHEREAS, the State has provided notice that an additional \$392,700 will be awarded to the City of Maple; and

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) are available under section 601(a) of the Social Security Act, as added by section 5001 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”); and

WHEREAS, under the CARES Act, the Coronavirus Relief Funds are available on a reimbursement basis and may be used to cover costs that (1) are necessary expenditures incurred due to the COVID-19 public health emergency; (2) are **not** accounted for in the most recently approved budget as of March 27, 2020; and (3) were incurred during the period of March 1, 2020 thru November 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager’s office recommends that the City seek reimbursement in an amount not to exceed \$247,000 for those expenses associated with the provision of economic support to businesses and community organizations in connection with the COVID-19 public health emergency and to seek reimbursement for the remaining amount for COVID-19 related City expenditures including fully funding Camp Wild 2.0 providing child care alternative to Tahoma School District Families in need; and

WHEREAS, the City Council would like to authorize the City Manager to seek reimbursement from the Washington State Department of Commerce up to the newly allocated amount of \$392,700 in CARES Act funding for eligible costs incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19 during the period of March 1, 2020 thru November 30, 2020, and to execute any necessary documentation related thereto;

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAPLE VALLEY,  
WASHINGTON, DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Authorization.** The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to seek reimbursement from the Washington State Department of Commerce up to the newly allocated amount of \$392,700 in CARES Act funding for eligible costs incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) during the period of March 1, 2020 through November 30, 2020, and to execute any necessary documentation related thereto.

**Section 2. Authorization.** The City Council further authorizes the City Manager to seek reimbursement in an amount not to exceed \$247,000 for those expenses associated with the provision of economic support in connection with the COVID-19 public health emergency and to seek reimbursement for the remaining amount for COVID-19 related City expenditures including Camp Wild 2.0 expenditures providing child care alternative to Tahoma School District Families in need.
