RESOLUTION NO. R-03-282

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MAPLE VALLEY, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH KING COUNTY FOR SERVICES RELATED TO THE PRESERVATION OF HISTORIC AND LANDMARK BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, historic and land preservation fosters civic pride in the beauty and accomplishments of the past and improves the economic values and vitality of landmarks; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Valley desires to designate, preserve, protect, enhance, and perpetuate those sites, buildings, districts, structures and objects that reflect significant elements of Maple Valley's cultural aesthetic, social, economic, political, architectural, ethnic, archaeological, engineering, historic, and other heritage, as well as those of the County, State and nation; and

WHEREAS, Maple Valley seeks to promote the continued use, exhibition and interpretation of such structures, sites, buildings, districts, and objects for the edification, education and enjoyment of Maple Valley residents; and

WHEREAS, King County is able to provide landmark designation and protection services for the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has elected to contract with King County to provide such services; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that the jurisdictions cooperate to provide efficient and cost effective landmark designation and protection;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAPLE VALLEY, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Authorization. The City Manager is authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the City the Interlocal Agreement for Landmark Services. The City Manager is also authorized to update Addendum B to the Interlocal Agreement for Landmark Services annually based upon City Council review of the amount as part of the annual City operating budget process. A copy of the Interlocal Agreement for Landmark Services has been filed with the City Clerk and been identified with the Clerk's Receiving No. 609.

Section 2. Prohibition Against Substantive Changes. The City Council prohibits the execution of said Interlocal if substantive changes are made or proposed by another party to the draft Agreement referenced in Section 1. The City Manager shall determine "substantive change" for the City. The City Manager is hereby authorized to make minor technical corrections to the proposed interlocal and associated reports or documents.

Section 3. Effective Date. The effective date of the Interlocal Agreement for Landmark Services shall be upon execution and signature by the King County Council.
